

Dear Friends,

By now you have all heard about Natural Church Development (NCD for short) if you have been in



worship at Christ United Methodist Church in the last six months. In short, it is an exciting process that I believe will help us move to a new level of ministry. I have gathered some interested people together and formed a strategy team around this Natural Church Development process. A survey will be taken soon (within the next 1-1/2 months) which will give us a reading of our congregational health. It does so by measuring eight quality characteristics: 1) Empowering Leadership, 2) Gift-based Ministry, 3) Passionate Spirituality, 4) Effective Structures, 5) Inspiring Worship Service, 6) Holistic Small Groups, 7) Need-oriented Evangelism, and 8) Loving Relationships.

To help us understand better this whole process I will take each of these quality characteristics and explain them in a bit more detail. In this way we may have a much stronger grasp of how healthy congregations display these characteristics.

We begin with Empowering Leadership. The guiding biblical text on this is Ephesians 4:11-13 where it talks about the gifts Christ gave to the church "that some would be apostles, some prophets...to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ..."

Empowering leadership is not about one special leader who has a great vision and needs volunteers to help them turn it into reality. That would be an "empowered" leader. We're not looking for gurus or superstars in this quality. The role here is one of empowering others, to equip, support, motivate and mentor others to become what God is calling them to be or become. The three essential ingredients of empowering leadership is explanation, motivation and liberation. If just one of these three is missing, the whole church will suffer.

The ingredient of "explanation" is essential. The ability to explain complicated, confusing, difficult realities to people through sermons, studies, teaching is really important. Motivating people is also very important. It is not enough to just explain something. Motivating people encourages them in their own discovery and journey. Liberation involves setting people free to fulfill their own God-given visions.

So this is empowering leadership. If a church is going to be at maximum health, ready and willing to equip the saints, build up the body of Christ and pave the way for the kingdom of God to grow; then we must develop this quality characteristic within and among the leadership of our church Next newsletter: Gift-based Ministry

EARN FREE MONEY FOR CHRIST UM CHURCH

If you shop at Kroger or Meijer (even if only occasionally), you can earn free money for the church.

Meijer has a Community Rewards program that gives a percentage of your spending to the charity of your choice. You just need to have your Rewards Card swiped before you finalize your purchase. The church's number is **564469**. You can sign up at www.meijer.com/rewards or pick up a form in the office.

The Kroger program is a gift card you <u>must</u> purchase from the church. All cards have a preloaded balance of \$5.00. Simply "load" your card at Kroger, using cash, check, or your favorite credit card. Then use that card to pay for your purchases. Each time you load

your card you earn 5% for the church. The card can be used at the fuel station and the pharmacy, also. As long as there is a balance on the card, it is good. Cards that have had a zero balance for 90 days are deactivated.

Both programs are good anywhere in the country.
